

There are two ways out-of-the-box Business Central can be set up in the multi-entity environment. One is to keep each entity in a separate BC company and the other one, similar to MEM, is to set up entities in the same BC company, delegating a global dimension to represent an entity.

For companies with different localizations, for example US and Canada, you MUST use separate BC companies. You can achieve this with BC out of the box functionality or with Intercompany Suite (ICS)
